### FEAST OF THE ASSUMPTION

Next week we will be celebrating the Feast of the Assumption, remembering the day that St Mary, Mother of Christ and the Mother of the Church, was taken into Heaven. This is a very special Mass for Aotearoa New Zealand.

Bishop Jean-Baptiste Pompallier was the first Catholic bishop of New Zealand. At the end of the first Mass he celebrated in Aotearoa New Zealand, on 13th January 1838, in Hokianga, he dedicated the country to Mary under the title of her Assumption. The New Zealand Catholic Bishops' Conference, in a pastoral letter in 1988 said:

*"In dedicating New Zealand to Mary in her Assumption, Bishop Pompallier placed our country under the protection of Mary as she is now – alive, body and soul, rejoicing in the happiness of God's kingdom."*



### SCHOOLWIDE PROGRESS AND ACHIEVEMENT




### WHOLE SCHOOL ACHIEVEMENT IN MATHEMATICS

### **RIPPA TOURNAMENT**


On Thursday this week our Rippa teams will be off to Windsor Park once again to compete in the Interschool Tournament. We wish them well in their games.
