MISSION FAIR THIS FRIDAY

This Friday the children will gather and participate in social outreach through our annual Mission Fair. Following feedback last year about the difficulty for parents to access coins, this year we are trialling a new format where funds can be contributed through Kindo. The joint beneficiaries this year are Loud Shirt Day (The Hearing House) and the I Am Hope Foundation.



I AM HOPE has one goal - positive societal attitudinal change. A number of NZ youth struggle with distressing self-talk and overthinking, leaving them feeling isolated and alone. They need to hear the message that these thoughts are universal. Over the past 10 years, I AM HOPE have spoken and listened to over 300,000 kids in schools from the top to the bottom of New Zealand. They are passionately committed to delivering immediate, free counselling to young Kiwis in need, and as a result of community support, they have enabled free counselling for over 10,000 young people.



The Hearing House is dedicated to helping children and adults with cochlear implants learn to listen and communicate. Through funds raised through Loud Shirt Day, their passionate and dedicated teams of audiologists, specialised therapists, and support staff deliver a range of services and programmes to assist babies, children and adults.

DANCE CURRICULUM




AHOY MATEY!

CHANGEOVER TO THE SUMMER UNIFORM

Term 4 marks the changeover to our Summer uniform. For more information on the uniform, please see the uniform page on the <u>school</u> website.

Due to the fluctuating weather, there will be a two-week period at the beginning of the Term where students can wear either uniform. We ask that the full Summer OR Winter uniform is worn and they are not mixed.

All students are required to be in full Summer uniform following Labour Weekend, from Tuesday 29th October.

Dress:	Blue check dress with white collar and red tie
Culottes:	Navy with school name
Shorts:	Navy with school name
Shirt:	Freight blue monogrammed short sleeve polo
Fleece:	Navy zip front monogrammed polar fleece
Ribbons:	Red, navy, blue or white
Shoes:	Leather sandals plain, flat black Roman sandal style
Hat:	Navy monogrammed bucket hat – Term 1 & 4

SUN SMART

As we move into the warmer months, it is important for all students to wear hats during outdoor activities to protect against the strong UV rays in New Zealand. Sun safety is a priority, and wearing hats helps ensure we stay safe and healthy while enjoying time outdoors.

All children are required to wear the school hat when playing outside in Term 4. This starts at the beginning of the term, irrespective of what uniform the children are wearing. If they do not have their hat, they will need to play in the shade. Hats can be purchased from NZ Uniform.

Please ensure that ALL items that your child/ren bring to school are clearly named.

We also ask that they bring their full P.E. uniform to school on Monday morning and that it is left at school then returned home on Friday if it needs washing.
