LENTEN RECONCILIATION



The Sacrament of Reconciliation, also known as Penance or Confession, is a sacrament in the Catholic Church where individuals confess their sins to a priest, express sorrow, and receive forgiveness from God, restoring their relationship with Him and the Church. While you can go at any time during the year, it is traditional to go during Lent, in preparation for Easter.

For our students who have received the Sacrament of Reconciliation, there will be the Rite of Reconciliation tomorrow at St John's Church.

SCHOOL EASTER LITURGY

As Easter falls in the school holidays this year, we will close for the term break **on Friday 11th April** at the normal time of 2:50pm.

The school will gather prior to the end of day bell to remember Christ's journey to the Cross with liturgy. We warmly invite parents and whānau to join us in this liturgy at 2:00pm in the hall. This liturgy is prepared and led by our Year 6 students and is always a moving experience. It is a special time of prayer and reflection, and we ask that no photos or videos be taken during the service. This helps us all remain fully present in the moment and respects the solemnity of the occasion. Thank you for your understanding and support.

There will not be a bell at the end of the day, and we ask that the children leave quietly in commemoration of this time.

Stations of the Cross Ngā Tūranga o te Rīpeka

These stunning stained-glass images were created by renowned New Zealand artist John Drawbridge (1930-2005) in 1990. The *Stations of the Cross* artwork, made from stained glass and steel, each measure 690mm x 525mm and are featured in *The Chapel of Our Lady of Compassion* in Wellington. These images beautifully reflect the themes of compassion, hope, and faith.



SCHOOL DISCO PROCEDURES

We ask that parents drop off their children at the back door to the hall where they will enter and be supervised by the rostered parents and staff. Thank you to those parents and staff who have volunteered to supervise the children in the hall. We know that, from past experience, a number of parents use this time to get together and socialise at a friend's house or down in the Bay. If you wish to remain onsite during the disco, you are welcome to pop down and wait in the staffroom. If your child is a bit anxious, this may be a good option as we can be contacted in the hall if necessary.

Doors will open for parents to come in approx. 5 minutes before the end of each disco (you may want to join your child for the last dance). We ask that parents come in the back door (by the kitchen), collect their children and exit through the front door (by the stage). For health and safety, no child will be able to leave the hall until collected by an adult.

SCHOOL DUES – IRD Tax Receipts

Please email Michele Nash, Principal's PA, michelen@sjmb.school.nz if you would like a one-page full year tax receipt to support your IRD tax deduction donation claim to 31st March 2025. Provided School Dues for Term 1 2025 have been paid and the receipt dated on or before 31st March, that amount will show on the receipt and can be processed in the tax year 1 April 2024 to 31st March 2025. Alternatively, if you are missing a receipt, please ask for a replacement, it is no trouble at all to duplicate. Attendance Dues are the only fee item that are **not** tax deductible.

Attendance Dues are paid monthly over to the Diocese Auckland Common Fund Ltd and should be paid in full at least two weeks before the end of any school term. In that regard, please feel free to contact Michele Nash michelen@sjmb.school.nz if payment of Attendance Dues will be delayed. Attendance Dues are receipted first from any payments parents make. He waka eke noa – we're all in this together and financial assistance from the Diocese is available for families who may be having trouble with paying the Attendance Dues if they have demonstrated an effort has been made to make payments at a level they can afford.

Shirt:	Freight blue long sleeve monogrammed polo (short sleeve can be worn with shorts or culottes if preferred)
Fleece:	Navy zip front monogrammed polar fleece
Hair ties:	Red, blue, white, black or brown
Shoes:	Black leather lace up, velcro, buckle or T-bar school shoes with a heel height of no greater than 2.5cm. Black trainers are not considered school shoes. If you are unsure, please discuss with the school.
Socks:	Black knee length wool/elastine mix school

This is needed so that we can code the absentee accurately for reporting to the Ministry of Education.







